About the Program

The Don Honorio Ventura State University Office for International Partnerships and Programs Kapampangan Language, Culture, and Heritage short-term courses are three-week inbound mobility programs offered to international students via face to face or virtual modes. Students will be taught task-based lessons and activities leading to the development of their conversational competence and cultural and relational intelligence.

The programs will be a combination of lectures, immersion, and various activities for practice and exposure. The inbound students will be assisted by select DHVSU students who are identified as culturally and relationally intelligent individuals. 'Buddy system' will be utilized to ensure the easy adjustments of students who would be having face to face instruction.

The OIPP will manage the programs and monitor its smooth delivery and implementation in coordination with concerned offices.

1.0 Introduction to Kapampangan Language

This short-term course is designed to acquaint students with the history of the Kapampangan language, its structure, its gramma, and its usage that will equip students with the fundamental requirements of communicative competence. Students will be exposed to Kapampangan readings and videos to develop their basic skills in listening, speaking, reading, and writing in Kapampangan.

Learning Objectives

At the end of the course, the students must have:

- developed an understanding of the Kapampangan language;
- distinguished between oral and written styles and adapted both oral and written messages for specific purposes;
- 3. executed conversational lines and expressions through oral and written forms;
- 4. applied basic rules in handling dialogues using the Kapampangan language;
- appreciate Kapampangans and their language by knowing the latter's nuances and intricacies.

2.0 Understanding Kapampangan Culture and Heritage

Kapampangans have very rich culture that makes them strikingly diverse people. In this short-term course, students will have a walk through the dynamic and colorful culture and heritage of the Kapampangans, with emphasis on their cuisine – Pampanga as the culinary capitol of the country, their art and fashion, their festivals and festivities throughout the year, and their remarkable heritage sites.

To be aware of one's cultural differences and complexities is insufficient, that is why this course is designed to include how harmonious relations contribute to the success of an individual, and in a wider perspective, of an organization, a community, or even a country. It further intends to provide students with a clearer perspective on what Kapampangan culture is, its dimensions and elements, and the implications of being culturally intelligent in building partnerships, linkages, connections, and relationships.

Learning Objectives

At the end of this course, the students must have:

- 1. known the history of Pampanga;
- acquainted themselves with the different festivals in Pampanga, famous cuisines, art and fashion, and other forms of entertainment;
- 3. recognized famous Kapampangan personalities;
- 4. developed cultural competencies;
- 5. tried any of the dimensions of Kapampangan culture and heritage;
- 6. appreciated Kapampangan culture and heritage.

About the Award

Guidelines

- Nominations will come from the community or civic organization where the alumnus/alumna is known to be a champion in terms of programs, projects, and activities.
- Only duly accomplished official nomination forms will be entertained by the Office for Alumni Affairs for screening. Official nomination forms will be made available and downloadable in the OAA page.
- 4. Each college or unit can have maximum of three (3) nominations.
- All nominations will undergo screening, validation, initial evaluation, and final evaluation with interview.
- Qualified aggrigges for final evaluation and interview will be notified via email and a phone call.
- 7. All decisions of the committee are final.
- 8. Awardees will receive a Plaque and a Token from the University.
